New vs. Old-Overlapping End-Joint System

Tips if you have both the old and new panel end joints.

New End Joint-Right (The short shingle is now on the right) Once you have a full row, use these.



Old End Joint-right (The long shingle was on the right) With these, finish your next full row and save the rest for cuts.



Old End Joint-Left (The short shingle was on the left) Finish the next full row and save the rest for cuts.



New End Joint-Left (The long shingle is now on the left) Once you have a full row, use these.



The new Cedar Valley panels have the end joints switched.

Because we have switched to an all 1-course line, the overlapping end joints have switched directions on new Cedar Valley shingle panels. We are labeling every pallet and marking every panel with "New" across the back. But in case you do get the new and old style on the same job, there are simple ways to use them together. The easiest way is to complete all partial rows with the old style and then switch to the new style when starting a new row. If you still have old style panels save them for areas where both factory end joints are removed. Examples are between trim & windows, windows & corners, chimneys & short walls and gables or dormers
